ASHP-Accredited PGY2 Residency in Oncology Pharmacy Practice NIH Clinical Center, Pharmacy Department Bethesda, Maryland

The primary goal of this one year *PGY2 Residency in Oncology Pharmacy Practice* is to provide an organized clinical and distributive postgraduate training program in oncology pharmacy practice. The resident will experience a unique opportunity to work alongside National Cancer Institute investigators to conceptualize, integrate, and transform accumulated experience and knowledge into improved drug therapy for cancer patients. This program focuses on providing comprehensive pharmaceutical care to both adult and pediatric cancer patients. Graduates of this program will be able to work in any oncology pharmacy practice setting and also be able to enter an oncology pharmacy fellowship.

- Pharmacy Service Orientation (≈ 5 weeks)
- Inpatient and Outpatient Adult Medical Oncology (≈ 12 weeks)
- Ambulatory Oncology (≈ 6 weeks)
- Bone Marrow Transplantation (≈ 6 weeks)
- Pediatric Oncology (≈ 6 weeks)
