



Are you being treated for hepatitis B?

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Researchers at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Clinical Center are investigating how long therapy for hepatitis B should continue and when it can be stopped. Volunteers for this study will stop current treatment and be monitored for four years. If you need to go back on treatment within that time, you can restart therapy with your own doctor or you may be eligible for participation in a treatment protocol for hepatitis B at the NIH. There is no cost to you for study-related tests or medications.

You may be eligible to participate if you:

- Are 18 years and older
- Have been treated for hepatitis B for longer than four years
- Are willing to discontinue current treatment

You may not be eligible to participate if you:

- Have hepatitis C
- Are HIV positive
