



Study for Muscular Dystrophy

Researchers at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Clinical Center are conducting a study on Fragile Sarcolemmal-associated Muscular Dystrophies (FSMD).

The goal of this study is to:

- identify biological indicators of the changes that occur in the muscle-cell membrane of people diagnosed with one of the FSMDs.

Consider this study if you have been diagnosed with one of the FSMDs: Limb-Girdle Muscular Dystrophy type 2B-F, I, L, Myoshi Myopathy, Becker Muscular Dystrophy, or Myoshi Muscular Dystrophy-3.

All study-related tests are provided at no cost to you.

You may be eligible if you:

- Are 18 years of age or older
- Have been diagnosed with one of the FSMDs
- Can walk 33 feet without walking aids or orthotics
- Can commit to multiple five day stays at the NIH
- Are under the care of a primary care physician

- Have active, on-going medical problems such as diabetes, renal, hepatic, pulmonary or cardiac disease
- Are taking anti-inflammatory drugs, narcotics or drugs with known myotoxicity
