

Healthy Research Volunteers Needed



The National Institutes of Health (NIH) in Bethesda, Maryland seeks healthy adult volunteers for a brain imaging research study. Researchers are using positron emission tomography (PET) and magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) to understand how dopamine is associated with learning, memory, and habit formation. Researchers will use PET and MRI imaging to measure dopamine with and without methylphenidate to better understand the role of dopamine in normal brain function. All study-related tests are provided at no cost to you. Compensation is provided.

You may be eligible for this study if you are:

- Healthy and 18 – 55 years old
- In good health without significant medical problems
- Currently not pregnant or breastfeeding

You may not qualify if you:

- Are unable to undergo an MRI
- Are unable to lay flat on your back for at least two hours
- Have a psychiatric or neurological disorder
- Have an alcohol or drug use disorder
